Good News

Detective Inspector Mick Roxby was pleased to report that a criminal gang responsible for almost 100 burglaries from residential and commercial properties across Norfolk between February and December 2017 has been convicted.

Nine members of the gang, mainly family members, along with three others who were found guilty of handling stolen goods will all be sentenced at a later date.

Broadband Improvements

Following further investigation it has now been identified that of the 23 properties initially identified as not being covered by the Norfolk County Council Better Broadband activity, 3 actually have access to improved Broadband now and new plans are in place to cover an additional 10 properties in 2019. The latest information provided by the Better Broadband team, on the properties not covered by the initial plans, is summarised below:

Properties that have access to improved Broadband

Welborne – Greenacre, Foxleigh, Old Hall Farm

Properties where a fibre to the premises solution is planned for 2019

Runhall - 1-6 East Green, Mill House, The Mordice, Wood Farm, Wood Farm Bungalow

Properties where no solution is currently planned

Brandon Parva – Old Rectory, White House Farm (already has access to 10-15 Mbps)

Coston – Coston Hall

Runhall – Low Farm, Low Farm Cottage

Welborne – 1-5 All Saints Close

Whilst there is no solution currently planned for these properties, Norfolk County Council has secured an additional £11m in funding to do further work beyond the current plans – see <https://www.norfolk.gov.uk/news/2018/11/11m-boost-for-broadband-in-norfolk>.
