No Cold Calling

Margaret Dewsbury, our County Councillor, had suggested that it might be possible for a whole village to be a 'No Cold Calling Zone'. In other words, no door-to-door selling allowed. It seems that this is not possible, so the County Council is looking to help areas that want to set up zones to protect local people who may be particularly vulnerable to this.

Dog Poo

It is, unfortunately, necessary to repeat warnings to a few irresponsible dog owners.

Dog owners are responsible for picking up dog poo and taking it home. This includes public footpaths. The whole of South Norfolk is covered by the Dogs (Fouling of Land) Act 1996, which makes it an offence not to clear up after a dog on any area of land that is open to the public, with a few exceptions.

Anglian Water sewage scheme in Welborne

Work has now begun on Welborne Road as well as Church Road. Both roads will remain closed while Anglian Water continue work on the project.

The Parish Council told Anglian Water of our disappointment that work had taken place on the grassy triangle in front of Welborne Village Hall with no prior warning and with no consideration of its use as a car park. However, reinstatement has now mostly been completed. We are chasing for further work to be done on levelling and more grass seed sowing. Hopefully, the grass will be sufficiently established before events begin again in the autumn at the village hall and the church.

Anglian Water kindly agreed to provide some 'SLOW' signs along Church Lane after a spate of accidents because of the very poor visibility caused by the maize growing on either side of the road as well as the usual potholes, stones and soil on the road.

If there are changes to road closures, details will be posted on the Welborne village website (welborne.org.uk) and also on the Parish Council website (bpcrwparishcouncil.info).

Noticeboards

The new noticeboards have arrived for Brandon Parva, Coston and Runhall. Bev hopes to arrange for their installation shortly with help from volunteers. Reading support for those with long term health conditions

Reading Well Books on Prescription helps people to understand and manage their health and wellbeing using helpful reading available from public libraries. Building on the success of existing schemes, a book list has been developed for people with long term health conditions and their relatives and carers. The titles provide information and advice to support living well with a long term condition.

The books cover common symptoms associated with living with a long term condition including pain, fatigue, sleeping problems, and mental health and wellbeing. It will also include condition-specific titles covering conditions such as arthritis and diabetes. All of the titles on the list can be reserved free of charge from any Norfolk library and online from the library website. The books are available to borrow for up to six weeks.
